

This **City Planner** project helps children develop their fine motor skills, but also be creative. It's amazing what you can do with some paper and glue! This project would be perfect for a **construction**, city, or building theme. Here's how to set it up!

Gather Your Materials

- construction paper
- scissors
- glue stick
- large roll of paper (we're using a big sheet of paper!)

Prepare Your Materials

Cut large squares and rectangles of different sizes and shapes. You'll also need a variety of triangles to be roofs. Next, cut small squares and rectangles to be doors and windows. Finally, you may want some skinny rectangles and small circles (from a hole punch) to be window trim and door knobs. Throw in a few trapezoids. (We cut them from the shape die cuts we have) Have some left over paper should kids want to add roads!

Separate your pieces, if possible. Add a glue stick. Cover your work surface with paper. And,

Invite your children to the table to make a city! They'll use the different shapes and colors to make a variety of buildings and houses.
