What's My Job - Trustee Training

Information on how to be an outstanding library trustee

Library Boards of Trustees bear the primary responsibility for public library missions, services, funding, resources and assets. Library Directors have direct daily executive responsibility for the library mission, services, finances resources and assets. So who is really responsible for what? The relationship between the director and board is a partnership in which both parties must fully participate. Resources are available to help trustees and directors find positive, effective and rewarding ways of working together.

Policy Update

Help in keeping your policies current

All library policies should be reviewed regularly. In the Spring of 2017 we are revisiting Financial Policies. Last month we reviewed some general information on Library Finance Policies. Here are some specific financial reporting responsibilities that trustees need to know:

- Every library files the State Annual Report: your library's primary reporting mechanism. It is filed with MVLS and the State Education Department early each year. Your continued status as a library depends on a complete and accurate state annual report.
- All libraries that receive any funding through public votes must file tax cap reports with the Office
 of the State Comptroller each year regardless of whether you had a vote that year. Report at:

- All libraries that have 501(c)(3) status must file an IRS 990 form. Information on filing rules is at: https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/exempt-organizations-required-filings
- All libraries that are public entities (not Association libraries) are required to file an annual update
 with the NYS Office of the State Comptroller. This is in addition to the tax cap reporting. Find

- All libraries must file IRS employee forms including W2s for employees and 1099s for nonemployee compensation. Find more at: https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/exempt-organizations-employment-tax-resources
