## 1. MVLS Board of Trustees meeting

NYS Paid Family Medical Leave must be provided by all Association libraries starting 1/1/2018. Your NYS disability insurance carrier will set this up for you. Public and school district libraries may opt in, but are not required to participate.

Seven MVLS libraries need to bring their Charter/Bylaws into line with current practice concerning number of trustees and trustee terms.

NYS DLD is working to develop new Minimum Standards for libraries. The proposed standards are online at:
