Mohawk Valley Library System Director's Report June & July 2018

Administration & Governance

State Aid distribution began in mid-July; a modern record. Most aid categories will be increased at just under 1%. We will do the associated budget amendments in September, once we have all of the updated figures for state aid and bullet aid. Typically Bullet Aid is released in October.

Glenn Winter from T.M. Byxbee was in to do the onsite part of our annual review in July. As always, the process went smoothly. Glenn expects to have the reviewed statements and IRS 990 form ready for your review by the September meeting.

The Building and Equipment Committee held their annual walkabout meeting on June 21. Several items were discussed including:

- Needed sealing and caulking of the front steps and back wall
- Possible future project to upgrade the heating system
- Possible future development of additional signage

The parking lot has been re-sealed and striped. Next year we may look at having more extensive repairs done.

Much behind-the-scenes work is being done to retire the MVLS server and switch our local file storage to OneDive. I will provide additional information at our August meeting. We are planning to have that process complete by the end of September.

I am on vacation in Rhode Island from August 6 - 10; and at the New York Association of Library Systems conference from August 15 - 17.

Automation and Resource Sharing

The Joint Automation Council met on July 11 at MVLS. The June software upgrade went well with welcome new changes to the public catalog. Two policies were amended and will be brought to the MVLS and SALS boards for final approval. We also discussed the budget and some upgrades to job descriptions. The next JA Council meeting will be at SALS on September 12.

Work continues on the many JA projects in the works, including the patron address project and implementing OneDrive to member libraries.

Outreach Services

The Outreach Advisory Council met on July 23. This group provides input into the Adult Literacy Grants. At the meeting, Karen Bradley from Schenectady and Nicole Hemsley from Amsterdam provided information on past grants. This year, since no libraries were interested in applying for their own projects, Lois has developed a job coaching project that libraries can participate in. So far six libraries/branches are interested. If there is sufficient interest, we may explore MVLS putting in

additional resources beyond the \$4,727 that New York State allocates for adult literacy at MVLS. Minutes from the Outreach Advisory Council meetings are now available on the MVLS website at: http://www.mvls.info/insidemvls/outreach-advisory-council/

For 2018 the Hale Creek facility will continue with the successful "Write for Your Life" program series. This will take up most of the Corrections state aid. Hale Creek is also seeking funding from Poets & Writers for the project.

MVLS is cooperating with UHLS and SALS in providing books for asylum seekers confined at the Albany County Jail. Lois has worked on selecting some of the materials.

Adult Services

Lois continues to work on developing the "Library Moon Walk" project with UHLS and SALS. This project, funded by the National Network of Libraries of Medicine, will help member libraries make connections with medical institutions and provide resources to library users. Much outreach is being done with various medical organizations, and a workshop is being planned for Monday, October 15.

Youth Services

The 2018 statewide Summer Reading Program "Libraries Rock!", is in full swing at MVLS member libraries. We are making great progress with Beanstack participation this year, with 14 libraries/branches using Beanstack and 1,013 patrons registered on the software.

The MVLS collection of Lego bricks continues to be well used at member libraries. We had an additional 10 bins of Legos donated this summer.

The 2017-18 Family Literacy Grant has been submitted. Through the project, 63 staff/volunteers were trained; with 140 programs presented by member library staff/volunteers utilizing the new training on providing effective programs for children. Year three of the project will be very similar. Funding continues to support the Picture Book City and 1000 Books Before Kindergarten projects. Picture Book City id progressing at the Woodlawn branch.

Summer Science @ the Library programs continue at member libraries. Wade had introduced kinetic sticks into the program. Dominos and magnetiles have been added to the MVLS STEM kits for use at member libraries.

The success of last April's Tri-State Teen Meet-up has Sue and her colleagues at SALS and UHLS planning for a second session on April 11, 2019.

Lois is working with several libraries on potential constriction projects. Applications are due by August 31. The Library Services Committee will meet in September before the September 20 Board meeting to determine recommended awards based on the applications. The MVLS board will need to approve a system proposal at he September meeting.

Lois is working with Schenectady to help them implement Project Outcome for their technology programs. This should help produce more useful data on the effectiveness and need for these programs.

The Capital District Library Council is coordinating library participation in the PBS Great American Read project.

We continue to work with the Johnstown Library on helping them get their newly approved school district public library chartered.

Advocacy & Awareness

We are now working with Gloversville on developing a new mission statement, and Wade is meeting with several other libraries to get more libraries participating. We will discuss this at the August meeting. Several stories are in the works for the stories.mvls.info site.

The Foundation held another successful fundraiser on July 31. Profit on the golf tournament was \$3,500.

The Foundation has approved two grant packages that we will ask the MVLS board to approve at the August meeting. \$4,500 has been allocated to advocacy grants and \$7,500 to the annual library public service grants that are available to every library. We will discuss at the August meeting. I would also like to have a discussion on other avenues we may want to explore for Foundation grants.

I mentioned above that I am at the NYALS Conference. The founding and remaining primary purpose of NYALS has been statewide advocacy for library funding. I can share some information at our August meeting on where this is going in the future.
