

INSECTS



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Early Literacy TALK: Using the word “bug,” play a rhyming game with that word. How many words and sounds can your child make? It doesn’t have to be real words – it is the sounds that you want them to hear.

Early Literacy VOCABULARY: Take out books about bugs from the library and try to find and NAME specific bugs. Remember to use science words for the insect: head, thorax, abdomen and to count legs. Look for spider webs outside and talk about what you see.

Early Literacy WRITING: Have your child draw a picture of a bug or bugs you have seen. Keep a “bug” journal of where and when you have seen specific bugs.

Early Literacy PLAY: Have your child help you plant a special flower that will attract butterflies in your garden, or windowsill. Ask for help at a garden center and include the child in the planting, playing with dirt and garden tools.

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
