4. Central Library Issues

Rob Lang is looking for input on CBA items. Doug Bixler would like a heads up about what libraries need re: graphic design. Mary Ann Warner can talk about collection issues.

5. JA Council / Polaris

Registration Issues: Sharon & Michele reviewed the new registration fields. The Statistical Class field now holds library chartered service area information. New user defined fields - on the screen where you put in the Driver's License number - hold information on Town/City and School District. For the few libraries where the service area is village or hamlet specific (FTH, FON, SHO, STJ) the new Statistical Class field also has options for the village of Schoharie, Village of St. Johnsville, and Tribes Hill CDA (contained within the Towns of Schoharie, St. Johnsville & Mohawk).

Libraries should add information to these fields where you have confidence that you have correct information. If you don't know, it is OK to leave one of these fields blank.

JA is working on a system that will automatically add correct information to all of these "geography" fields. That process should be up-and-running within a few months.

Please note that the information in these fields is location of residence, not mailing address. Many people have a city in their address that does not reflect the town where they live - many people who live in Guilderland have a Schenectady address, for example. Also, there is no change to the recommended verification procedures for addresses.

<u>Fees</u>: Eric reviewed the new fee structure. As of the January 2018 billing - which libraries receive in February - fees will be based on the circulation and item counts as of 12/31/17. Each year JA will determine a fee budget number, and each library's share will be based on the item and circulation counts for the previous year; billed monthly as the item fee is done now. This change was necessary to keep the JA functioning in an environment of declining holdings and circulation. Contact Eric with any questions.
