ADVOCACY UPDATE

It's official: the New York State Legislature passed the state budget.

Most importantly for public libraries, the budget includes \$99.6 million in Library Aid, a \$5.5 million increase from last year. It also includes \$34 million in Library Construction Aid, the same as last year. Both are increases from Governor Hochul's original budget proposal.

These increases came about through the advocacy of libraries across the state. Within MVLS, more than 20 individuals participated in virtual advocacy meetings. Other individuals and libraries sent letters to legislators asking them to support this critical investment.

In addition to the advocacy meetings, ongoing outreach throughout the year keeps legislators well-informed on the important services libraries provide for their communities. Many of our libraries hosted legislators at a variety of events: from town halls to library tours.

Establishing and sustaining these lines of communications helps legislators prioritize specific legislation and budget requests, and it can even result in direct support from legislators such as bullet aid grants.

There will be more opportunities for advocacy at the local, state, and federal levels. Please contact us with your ideas, and thank you for your advocacy efforts!
