Director Eric Trahan welcomed everyone to the sixty-fifth Annual Meeting of the Mohawk Valley Library System. He thanked everyone all for coming here to celebrate libraries and taking the chance to get to know one another better. It's become a tradition to have these annual meetings in our libraries (we'd love to have it at your library!) and tonight we are at the Fort Hunter Free Library. Eric introduced Beverly Osborne, the President of the Fort Hunter Free Library Board. Beverly welcomed everyone and invited us all to take a look at the library itself. She thanked Letah for creating the centerpieces for the tables with pumpkins donated from Garden Bug, a local store. The oldest person at each table can take the centerpiece home!

As this meeting is a celebration of libraries, there are lots of ways to honor libraries tonight. On each table is a copy of the Annual Meeting report, which talks about what MVLS libraries have done this year. On the walls are the posters that each library helped us make this year. We also celebrate our libraries with the Awards that we give out at the Annual Meeting. Eric encourages everyone to network after the meeting, to get to know each other and make connections. The Annual Meeting is also a learning opportunity, and Mary Carrier will be talking about Elevator Speeches later on in the meeting.

Eric wanted to discuss the four goals that MVLS set during our planning process last year:

- 1. MVLS Empowers Libraries with the Vision & Knowledge for Secure Futures: Eric is always talking about the importance of going to your community for an annual budget vote. This year, our libraries added \$240,000 to their budgets with annual budget votes!
- 2. MVLS Empowers Libraries with the Skills, Tools, & Resources for Serving All: This year, Beth Rienti put together Memory Care kits that are available for you to take out and use with your patrons.
- MVLS Empowers Libraries with Collaboration for Outstanding Library Service:
 Collaboration is key! This summer, we had another great collaborative program with the
 MVLS-GO trading cards. A binder of those cards can be seen at the back wall by the
 posters.
- 4. MVLS Empowers Libraries with Inspiration & Methods for Telling the Library Story: We'll be awarding prizes to each library who has a brave soul willing to give their Elevator Speech tonight, and practice telling their library's story with us.

Eric then introduced MVLS Staff, MVLS board members, member libraries directors, member library board members, and member library staff. It is an honor to be here with you all tonight!

MVLS traditionally gives out three awards at the MVLS Annual Meeting. The first is the Harold & Junice Wusterbarth Volunteer Service Award, which honors a volunteer or trustee. This year, we didn't receive any nominations for this award which is a great reminder to nominate your volunteers for this award in the future.

The second award traditionally given out is the Library Recognition Award, which honors a library program. This year there were also no nominations for this award.

Two years ago, we established our third MVLS Award, the Outstanding Library Staff Award, which honors a staff member at an MVLS member library for outstanding efforts and/or results in providing library service to community members. This year, we have two staff members who are receiving this award. The MVLS Outstanding Library Staff award is awarded to Courtney Little from The Community Library, Cobleskill and Samantha Zimmerman from the Fort Plain Free Library.

Kim Zimmer of The Community Library spoke about her outstanding staff member, Courtney Little. Courtney joined the team in 2022 as the Library Assistant for Youth Services. She comes from a museum educator background, and shortly after joining the library it was clear that she was going to turn the youth program around. She reorganized the children's space, worked to broaden teen engagement efforts with new resources and programming, and worked with staff to create new arts and crafts programs. Her outreach efforts with school and community organizations have resulted in impressive increases in program attendance. As if all this wasn't enough, she enrolled in the Information Sciences graduate program at SUNY and is well on her way to pursuing her library degree. Thank you for all you do, Courtney!

Whitney Hubbard from the Fort Plain Free Library spoke about her outstanding staff member, Sam Zimmerman. The staff of the Fort Plain Free Library work together as a strong team, and they wanted to nominate Sam not just because of what she's done this year, but for the immense amount of effort and drive she has put in to everything she does since joining the library staff. They first met Sam when she painted a square on Fort Plain's community mural several years ago. Years later, she started to volunteer at the library, where she went about making herself indispensable. From a very small part-time position, she's now a full-time staff member. She's been involved in many programs, including her incredibly popular Monday music lessons, a composer's guild, and playing the ukulele at story-time every week. A long time ago, she started talking about how fun it would be to create library-related trading cards, and last spring, she set out making a set of trading cards for the library's summer reading program. This ended up being expanded to the entire MVLS-GO trading card initiative. Creating trading cards for all 14 libraries was a tall order, and she did it without fear. Thank you for all you do, Sam!

Mary Carrier spoke to remind folks about the importance of having an "elevator speech" about your library to spread the word about how important libraries are in our communities. Mary thinks it's wonderful that we all have the ability to talk about our libraries with passion. She invited everyone present to give their elevator pitch to the library.
